

As I approach my 30th anniversary as Evangel Home director in May, it is a bittersweet time. I am planning to retire at the end of this year. I've always thought that the call from God to retire would be as clear as His call to lead the ministry, and it was.

As I prepare for that time, I first want to highlight a few things about Evangel Home. Last fall, staff member Sarah Dawson asked what she could learn and how she could prepare to someday be the director. As a Christian ministry, we are dedicated to our motto: Christ Leads, People Care, Lives Change. That remains our commitment, and I pray that people will continue



to care, perhaps even more, during this year of transition. There are still precious women coming to us who need the hope of Christ and the support and acceptance they receive at Evangel Home.

As a "small business," we run a tight ship. We will continue to be as transparent with finances, and as open and honest with our decisions, as we always have been.




Darrell & Diane Miller: Our Praying Donors



FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you for letting us end the year with a little extra money. We received a total of \$865,000 and spent \$836,000. Taking the top seven categories in income and expense, a general summary looks like this:
