In Memory of Loretta White

This has been a difficult year for a number of significant people in Evangel Home's history — either leaving or passing away. We wanted to acknowledge the impact one woman in particular had on our Home. Loretta White was introduced to Evangel Home in the late 80s when one of our graduates, Janice Woods, told Gerre there was someone she should meet. Loretta was instrumental in bringing greater diversity to chapel services. In October, while

attending Loretta's celebration of life, we learned more about Loretta.

Her grandson, now a young professional man, said she taught him about serving others. One of those ways was by taking him as a little boy to participate in the chapel services she conducted at Evangel Home. He then told us of his grandmother's favorite quote by Maya Angelou, "Be a rainbow in someone else's cloud," which is exactly how she lived her life.

Gerre spoke at her service and this is what she had to say about Loretta. "In her life, she faced prejudice, discrimination, lack of respect and could have stored up a lot of hate. But she had accepted Jesus and said there was no room in her heart for hate. There really is no such thing as righteous hate because it will eat you up. Somebody said that not forgiving is like drinking rat poison and waiting for the rats to die. Loretta was not going to drink the poison, and so she chose love and forgiveness. She chose to walk hand in hand with Jesus."

Even in her death, her greatest desire was for people to know her sweet Savior. It was a privilege to have Loretta be a part of teaching this good news to the women of Evangel Home. Many lives are forever changed!

WHY I SUPPORT EVANGEL HOME



Having lived in Fresno since 1966, and my dad involved in low rent housing, I have personally witnessed the government's subsidy system. Called Welfare back then, it provided money alone as the fix to most people's urgent problems in life.

Sure, it did allow them to provide a roof over their heads and some food on the table, but there was not much guidance in how to manage a budget, and virtually no help in teaching how to stretch the money to the end of the month. My father used to call the first of the month "Mother's Day," since that's when the checks would arrive for everyone. If my dad wasn't right there to collect the rent when the mailman delivered those checks, there was a good chance he wouldn't get the rent at all.

As a high schooler, I watched this pattern occur every month. I wondered why there was not a better way to teach people how to live. Then Leslie, my wife, came into my life and I found out about Evangel Home and what they do for women and children who have reached the end of their rope and run out of resources or have had family circumstances that compel them to seek other living arrangements. Leslie's Great Aunt, Pauline Baker Meyer, just happened to be one of the founding principles of the Home, and that made it even more meaningful to us to have someone in the family that had a heart to serve women and children in a way the government was not capable.

It was 1988 when we first were able to commit to supporting Evangel Home on a regular basis, and we have been in it for the "long haul" ever since. We are not aware of any other local organizations that have the ability to impact women and children on the levels that Evangel Home does: physical, emotional, practical, and spiritual. All without the help of any government aid or control. For us, it's the best investment of our resources, locally, that we can make. Won't you consider joining us for the 'long haul'?


1. PLAYGROUND PADDING

CHRISTMAS SPONSORSHIP

Would you like to become a sponsor for a woman or a family staying at Evangel Home? Below are answers to some of the most-asked questions about Christmas sponsorship.

WHAT IS A CHRISTMAS SPONSOR?

A Christmas sponsor is a family, individual or group who donate gifts specifically chosen for one of our women or families who are participating in an Evangel Home long-term program such as the GARDEN, Community Connection or CrossRoads

HOW DOES A SPONSOR KNOW WHAT TO BUY?

Sponsors know exactly what to buy because each woman prepares a "wish" list which has been composed following specific guidelines so that requests are appropriate and none too costly. Sponsors do not need to purchase everything on the list.

WILL I BE ABLE TO MEET MY FAMILY OR PERSON?

Yes. This can be worked out between you and them. We do ask, however, that any meeting take place at Evangel Home.

• WHAT ABOUT THE CRISIS HOME RESIDENTS?

Those women and children living in the Crisis Home are remembered through generous donations of generic, unwrapped gifts since we never know in advance who will be here for Christmas.

• MAY I BE PRESENT WHEN MY GIFTS ARE OPENED?

You may be present if you are sponsoring a woman or family who are either in Community Connection or CrossRoads. Residents in our GARDEN program open their gifts together on Christmas morning.

HOW DO I BECOME A SPONSOR?

Simply call the Evangel Home (264-4714) and ask to speak to Ruby Cox or Gina Walker. You can also email them at crossroads@evangelhome.org. At that time, you may specify your desire to sponsor an individual or family.



GIFT IDEAS FOR THE CRISIS HOME

Selecting gifts for our women and children living in the Crisis Home isn't as specific as for our other residents because we do not know who will be here. Please leave these gifts unwrapped or their specific contents listed on the outside of each package. Wrapping paper, ribbon, tape and scissors would also be very much appreciated. This may be the first time that a mother wraps a gift for her children.
