# Finding God's Rest

I have wondered often over this last year if we are experiencing something like the year of Jubilee. According to Leviticus, every fifty years God's provisions would be enough for the people and land



of Israel to take a year to be restored. Slaves were to be released, land returned to its former owner, debts forgiven, etc. While this seems pretty amazing, it seems like it came at a cost. What about those who have been working the land in the meantime? Where do they go now? Can you imagine the upheaval it must have caused to get that restoration? We as humans can get so attached to people, traditions, and the way we think things should go. We can think that all of these patterns, these possessions, and associated burdens belong to us when they don't. I imagine that having to return things every fifty years would help keep things in perspective, reminding the Israelites that their land and possessions belonged to God. Still, it must have been painful when the control over their lives was stripped away.

With the world and our nation in upheaval, it can be difficult to see any good. Things are uncertain and it is hard to live with uncertainty. What if this year is an opportunity for things to be restored, and this is part of that painful process? Will it be worth it? I absolutely believe that even though these circumstances are painful now, we will see great things on the other side, as we trust our great and wonderful God. We have the privilege of knowing and believing that God is good. We know that no matter the turmoil we can still praise Him. We can still trust Him. We know that even in the midst of this there is one thing that is certain: those who confess Jesus Christ as Lord, believe that He died, was raised again and now sits with the Father in heaven, have the promise of being with Him forever. This is not our home. We are just here for the moment. Our home is with Him forever. 2 Corinthians 4:17 "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."

Many of us are tired, if not plain exhausted. And yet, even in this exhaustion, I find hope because it reminds me of the reason that Evangel Home exists. Our founding verse in Matthew says, "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest." We are here so that those women who have been worn down by life can come and find rest. I am grateful for and praying for each of you that read this, that you will find rest in God as you trust Him today.

# **COVID UPDATE**

In the last newsletter, we were in the very beginning stage of the pandemic and we were just starting to adjust to all the new rules. We asked staff to stay home if they were potentially

at higher risk. We consolidated the GARDEN and Crisis residents and were not accepting new intakes, as we figured out how to proceed safely.

As time went on, we learned more about COVID and were able to move those in Crisis and GARDEN to their own apartments next door or to their next phase beyond Evangel Home. After each resident was able to find a place, we closed our doors for a few days while we prepared to let new residents come in. This was a daunting task as we searched how to balance bringing new people in and

continuing to make it safe for incoming residents and staff. One of the adjustments was to decrease our max capacity to about half of what it was before, in accordance with government recommendations. This allowed for more space and less possibility of contamination. We have been taking temperatures twice a day, wearing masks in common areas, washing our hands frequently, and wiping down surfaces. Many of you went out of your way to make sure we had all the PPE we needed to reduce the risk of people getting sick.

We were really blessed that for several months we did not encounter the virus. However, near the end of August, we saw our first case of COVID on campus. Although we had a plan in place for this, we were still a little shaken. Shortly after this, we had our second positive case. We are so grateful that these were two isolated cases and there was no outbreak on campus. The situation caused us to pause again and reevaluate. Some residents got understandably scared and chose to leave. Others we allowed to stay quarantined in one of the apartments next door. We cleared out and cleaned up the Crisis Home. A generous donor came in and

used a chemical fog to decontaminate the Home. We left our doors closed for a few days while we used the newly cleaned Home to stage our "Banquet-in-a-Bag" fundraiser. We then took some time to re-examine our "COVID Rules" to see what we could do differently or better. continued on page 4

In September we reopened again with adjusted rules. Since then, our population has been very low but increasing day by day. We continue to pray and seek what God would have us do to get this house in order to prepare for whatever comes next. Acts 27 and 28 have been particularly encouraging during this time. Paul and his shipmates faced the possibility of shipwreck and loss of everything including their lives in the midst of a terrible storm. They lost the ship and everything on it except for the people's lives. God saved them and they landed on an island where they were treated with kindness and given a chance to regroup for a few months before they finally made it to their destination. It feels like we have made it through the storm and are in the regrouping time right now. We have had a lot of loss this year, having had to say goodbye to programs and staff members as they move on to other places. We are no different. We have also had to say goodbye to many things and people we have loved.

This year, Evangel Home had to say goodbye to our beloved GARDEN program. There were a couple of reasons for this program closure. A few years ago there were new laws implemented that no longer utilized alternative sentencing for inpatient programs. Since that time, we have averaged around two people in the program when it was formerly at capacity with six women. During this same time period, overall income at

Evangel Home had not kept up with our expenses. It was no longer a wise use of our resources to continue this program. When shelter-in-place first started, we combined Crisis and, GARDEN to reduce staffing challenges.

What are we doing with the GARDEN home now? Currently it is set up as a classroom but we do not yet know what God will do with this home in the long run. Will you pray with us as we discover what will be needed next?

We also had to say goodbye to many staff this year for a variety of reasons:

new jobs, wanting to be with family, health concerns, not enough work, moving away, and others.

# FINANCIAL UPDATE

This has been a super interesting year! We have tried to cut expenses in many areas while also increasing our income. You have truly blessed us! We are on track to have reduced expenses by about \$80,000 this year and are planning to continue this reduction into the next year. Through the end of October we were down about \$37,000. We would love your participation in helping us end this year in the black! We have a few extra year-end expenses so we will need about \$90,000/month in November and December to end this year positively.


